



Minutes for June 9, 2026 Council Meeting

The Howardwick City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, June 9, 2026 at 6:00pm in City Hall with the Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem, Council members, City Secretary and 3 guests.

1. Call to order: Mayor called meeting to order at 6pm
2. Invocation: Johnny Floyd gave the invocation
3. Pledge of allegiance: Everyone stood for the pledge of allegiance
4. Approve minutes for May 12, 2026: Mary made a motion to approve the minutes for 5-12-26. Matt seconded the motion. Vote taken. All approved with none opposed. Motion carried.
5. Approve bills due: Johnny Hubbard asked about gas card billing and Storm Sirens billing. Sandy told members that the siren in Nocona Hills section was not working and had to be repaired. No longer under warranty. Fuel bill was high do to fire department with several mutual aid calls and fire here in Howardwick. Matt then made a motion to pay the bills. Jada seconded the motion. Vote taken. All approved with none opposed. Motion carried.
6. Mayors comments: Touched on Hoedown and Llama raffle tickets for sale.
7. Citizens comments and/or Public comments on Agenda items: At this time any citizen who has filled out an appearance card prior to meeting will be heard in order that card was turned in and as time allows. Each person will have 3 minutes. In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, the City Council may not deliberate or vote on any matter raised regarding Citizens comments. In order to complete City Business this portion of the meeting will be limited to 15 minutes: With no citizens comments, proceeded to item #8.
8. Council to discuss parcel R102818 and demolition order. Need a final conclusion on enforcement. Take action: Council discussed current condition of the property owned by Mr. Merwin Clark, parcel R102818. A

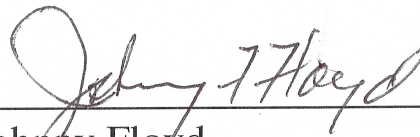

Members discussed options, including demolition of the property that was already approved on December 9, 2025. Johnny Hubbard felt like there was not much left to clean up. Terry had gone to the property and expressed that there was a lot left to clean up, including the metal and tree limbs. The door was replaced on the shed we asked to be torn down so was decided it could stay. Jada had concerns with so many chances given, we needed to resolve so others won't expect the same.
